# 2022 Gear Reimbursement Grant

Instruction and Application Packet

#### **ABOUT THE GRANT:**

This grant aids residents in obtaining new and efficient gear to maximize their harvest efforts by providing financial assistance in the form of reimbursement of associated costs to APICDA residents who purchase gear for subsistence harvest and/or commercial fishing use. The residents of Akutan, Atka, False Pass, Nelson Lagoon, Nikolski, and St. George are eligible to apply for this grant.

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**

Applicants must meet the following requirements to qualify for reimbursement of gear expenditures:

- 18 years old and physically capable to participate in subsistence and/commercial fisheries.
- Submit a complete application form with all attachments during application period.
- Copy of ID or driver's license.
- Provide documentation of residency in an APICDA community.
- Provide documentation of current year AFD&G,
   CFEC, or subsistence permit (if required)
- Provide receipts as proof of the cost of gear.
- Provide current personal contact and banking information for disbursement of funds.

# **Accepting Applications March 1 - December 1**

## **GRANT DETAILS:**

- Applicants may submit a commercial application or a subsistence application or both, if separate qualified receipts are provided with each application. Applicants may apply more than once to meet reimbursement threshold.
- Only permit holders (current year ADF&G or CFEC) owning/ leasing a vessel may submit for the commercial gear grant. However, deckhands may provide proof of their crew license or SHARC card to qualify for protective gear purchased for commercial fishing.

## **EXAMPLES OF ITEMS APPROVED FOR REIMBURSEMENT:**

- Fishing Related Items, i.e., fuel used for commercial fishing or subsistence, bait, gear, personal protective gear, safety equipment, navigational aids, vessel and gear storage, travel lift fees, parts for repairs, replacement or maintenance to vessels, equipment or machinery and, ancillary items used to increase efficiencies while commercial fishing or subsistence harvesting.
- Vessel, skiff or ATV purchase, repair, or maintenance must be used in commercial fishing or subsistence applications.
- Materials for constructing or maintaining meat preservation structures for subsistence harvested wild game/seafood, i.e., smokehouse, game shed.
- Shipping costs associated with approved gear from vendor to resident.

#### ITEMS NOT APPROVED AND NOT LIMITED TO:

Fuel costs associated with vessel transport, moorage, taxes, permits, quota, fines, insurance, loan payments, firearms, or ammunition.

# **General Instructions**

## **Purpose of Form**

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN). individual taxpaver identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

• Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1099-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-MISC (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-B (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-K (merchant card and third party network transactions)
- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding,
